Make sure you stay organized. One suggestion is getting an accordion folder and setting up files with the name of the scholarship, the due date, and then a post-it with what is required. Pay close attention to applications with a "postmarked by" and "received by" due dates – mail those a few days ahead of time!

Gather official and unofficial transcripts. Each of you has a code to access your own official and unofficial transcripts on <a href="http://www.parchment.com">http://www.parchment.com</a>. You can pick up your code from Mrs. Brinkman or I can send it to you.

Start to get letters of recommendations from a teacher, coach, community member and employer (if you have one). There are forms you can fill out with your personal info (goals, grades, what you've done, what you want to do) to hand to folks so they know more about you. Get one HERE.
