

# MSD Enhanced Remote Instructional Learning Steps 2020-2021



<b>Step 1</b> <b>100% Remote Learning</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• All students and staff participate daily in remote learning to include both synchronous and asynchronous learning. Buildings are closed for access.</li></ul>
<b>Step 2</b> <b>Enhanced Remote Learning</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Most students will participate daily in remote learning to include both synchronous and asynchronous learning. Students in greatest need of additional support, as identified through an agreed upon set of criteria, participate onsite with in-person instruction if the safety of staff and students can be ensured. Staff are able to be onsite for the purpose of planning and delivering remote instruction.</li></ul>
<b>Step 3</b> <b>Hybrid Learning with Early Childhood</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• All students from Step 2, as well as our youngest learners (K-2), additional students in need of support will participate onsite with in-person instruction. Two or three weeks later, our 3rd -5th grade students will participate onsite with in-person instruction. All other students participate in remote learning with both synchronous and asynchronous learning. Staff are able to be onsite for the purpose of planning and delivering remote instruction.</li></ul>
<b>Step 4</b> <b>Hybrid Learning</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• All students in Steps 2 and 3 will continue with their current in-person program and schedule. All other students 6th - 12th grade will participate onsite with in-person instruction two (2) days a week as well as remote learning for three (3) days. Staff will be onsite for the purpose of planning and delivering instruction.</li></ul>
<b>Step 5</b> <b>100% In-Person</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• All students and staff participate onsite with in-person instruction five (5) days a week.</li></ul>
